

How does the Tencon Health Plan work?

When you enroll in the Tencon Health Plan, you will be asked to choose a doctor from the list of participating primary care doctors. You will also receive information about how to use Tencon Health Plan services.

Once you receive your Tencon Health Plan ID card in the mail (about two weeks after you enroll), you can start receiving program services. When you call the primary care doctor you are assigned to, tell the office that you are in the Tencon Health Plan. Your primary care doctor will provide or arrange all of your care. Your doctor will refer you to the right specialist and make arrangements for x-rays and lab tests if you need them.

It doesn't cost you anything to enroll and be a member of the Tencon Health Plan. Some services require a small co-pay.

What is the Tencon HealthPlan?

TenCon Health Plan is a community-sponsored program that helps uninsured people get medically necessary health care services.

What Does the Tencon Health Plan Cover?

The Tencon Health Plan covers medically necessary health care services including:

- Doctor visits
- Health check-ups
- Outpatient lab tests
- Outpatient x-ray tests
- Prescriptions from pharmacies if on the list of covered drugs

How do I become a member of the Tencon Health Plan?

Call your local health department. A representative will ask you a few simple questions to see if you meet the eligibility requirements. If you do, you will be asked to bring with you:

Proof of income (at least one):

- Recent paycheck stubs
- Unemployment checks
- Social Security benefit statements
- Previous year's tax form
- Other proof of income

Proof of current address (at least one):

- Driver's license
- Michigan ID
- Recent utility bill or paycheck stub with name and address on it

Who is eligible for the Tencon Health Plan?

Persons determined eligible for the Tencon Health Plan must meet the following criteria:

- Be a resident of the District Health Department #10 service area.
- Not be eligible for Medicaid, Medicare, or employer paid health insurance
- Do not have any health insurance or any other health benefits.
- Be a citizen of the United States or a legal
