

DISTRICT HEALTH DEPARTMENT #10 BRINGS AWARENESS TO WORLD AIDS DAY

November 25, 2019– December 1st marks the 31st anniversary of World AIDS Day. Across the globe, this day offers an occasion to show support for those living with HIV, inform the public of HIV services available to them, and to remember those who have died from the infection.

Although antiretroviral therapy has transformed HIV from a nearly always fatal infection into a manageable chronic condition, HIV remains a global health threat. According to the World Health Organization (WHO), in 2018, worldwide approximately 37.9 million people were living with HIV, an estimated 770,000 people died from HIV - related illnesses, and about 1.7 million people were newly infected with HIV.

The CDC recommends that everyone between the ages of 13 and 64 get tested for HIV at least once as part of routine health care, as 1 in 7 people in the United States who have HIV, don't know they have it.

Individuals at high risk should get tested at least once a year. High risk individuals include those who have had sex with an HIV-positive partner, shared needles, have had more than one sex partner since last HIV test, exchanged sex for drugs or money, been diagnosed with a sexually transmitted disease, or men who have sex with men (MSM).

District Health Department #10 (DHD#10) provides free HIV testing, year-round. Services are non-judgmental, confidential, LGBTQ+ friendly, and no one will ever be denied service due to inability to pay. Call 888-217-3904, option #2 to schedule an appointment at your local DHD#10 office. If concerned about scheduling an appointment during regular business hours, DHD#10 will work with individuals to offer flexible scheduling and appointments. Walk-ins are also always welcome; however, appointments are highly recommended.
