



## GOVERNOR LIFTS 'STAY HOME, STAY SAFE' EXECUTIVE ORDER

June 4, 2020 – On June 1, Governor Whitmer signed <u>Executive Order 2020-110</u> rescinding her 'Stay Home, Stay Safe' executive order and moving the State of Michigan to Phase 4 – Improving – of the <u>Michigan Safe Start Plan</u>.

With the Governor's signature, Michiganders are no longer required to stay at home and may move freely about the State. However, that does not mean all of Michigan has reopened. Certain business outlined in the Executive Order must remain closed and activities considered a high risk for infection remain prohibited.

## Order 2020-110 ALLOWS:

- Retailer stores to reopen June 4 with restricted capacity
- Restaurants, bars and children's day camps to reopen June 8 with restricted capacity
- Libraries and Museums to reopen June 8
- Outdoor pools to reopen at 50% capacity on June 8
- Local outdoor parks and recreational facilities to reopen, unless prohibited by local regulations
- Groups of 100 people or less to meet outdoors if proper social distancing measures are in place
- Office work that is unable to be performed virtually and in-home services such as housecleaning to resume

## Order 2020-110 DOES NOT ALLOW:

- Amusement parks; arcades; bingo halls; bowling alleys; casinos, millionaire parties, and racetracks licensed by Michigan Gaming Control Board; indoor fitness, sports and recreation facilities such as climbing facilities, dance areas, exercise facilities and studios, fitness centers, gymnasiums, recreation centers, sports facilities, and skating rinks; personal care services that involve close contact such as body art facilities, hair salons, massage businesses, nail salons, piercing services, tattoo parlors, and traditional spas; tanning salons; indoor theaters, cinemas, and performance venues; and trampoline parks
- Indoor gatherings of more than 10 people

These entities must remain closed during this time as they involve close contact and shared surfaces and are considered a high risk for the spread of COVID-19. According to Governor Whitmer, her goal is to shift to Phase 5 – Containing – before July 4.

"We are pleased to see that restrictions are easing, and we can resume some normal activity," stated Kevin Hughes, Health Officer for DHD#10. "It is important, however, that everyone please continue to follow the guidance of social distancing and masking to prevent COVID-19 from creeping back up. The last thing we all want is for businesses and activities to be restricted again because we didn't adhere to simple prevention measures."

Though the 'Stay Home, Stay Safe' order has been lifted, Michiganders must continue to wear facial coverings in enclosed places and should continue to protect themselves and the people around them as much as they can. This includes conducting work from home "to the maximum extent possible" as quoted by the State of Michigan press release.
