DRIVE-THRU FLU SHOT CLINICS: WEXFORD COUNTY

Health experts urge all who can to get their flu shot

This year's flu season coincides with the COVID-19 pandemic, increasing the public's risk for developing a respiratory illness with potentially serious complications.

Fortunately, a safe, effective vaccine already exists for the seasonal flu and is updated each year in anticipation of the most prevalent flu strains.

The flu shot has proven benefits for people of all ages and is the best defense against the influenza virus. The CDC recommends everyone 6 months and older get vaccinated, including pregnant women. Each year, the flu vaccine prevents millions of adults and children from getting sick with this serious and potentially life-threatening virus.

Health experts warn that it's even more important than ever to get this flu shot this year. While the best time to get your flu shot is before the season hits, it's never too late.

There will be no out-of-pocket costs for participants. Insurance will be billed for those who have insurance. The vaccine is free for those without insurance. Face coverings are required at all events.

“This is a great opportunity for families with small children as there is no need to unpack them from the vehicle and into a building and back” states Bethanie Dean, RN, Immunization Coordinator, District Health Department #10. “This also makes it easier for our seniors and disabled population to get vaccinated.”

Additionally, thanks grant funding from the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services, the Wexford County Adolescent Health Centers at Cadillac Area Public Schools, Mesick Consolidated Schools and Manton Consolidated are providing every individual who receives an influenza vaccine at any of these drive-thru clinic will receive a \$5 Subway or Little Caesar’s gift card. That’s a gift card for every single person - including children.

This clinic is part of a regional effort to improve influenza vaccination rates across Northern Michigan in a collaborative effort between District Health Department #10, other local public health agencies, Munson Healthcare and their regional hospitals, Visiting Nurses Association, the Wexford Adolescent Wellness Center, the Manton Adolescent Wellness Center and the Mesick Adolescent Wellness Center.

Kevin Hughes, Health Officer for District Health Department #10 explained, “We are grateful for the efforts and collaboration across multiple organizations to deliver this important public health service,” stated Kevin Hughes, Health Officer for District Health Department #10. “Not one single entity had the capacity to do this alone. By pooling our resources, we can now reach more community members than we would have individually. This is public health at its best.”
