

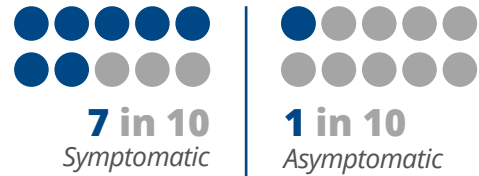
COVID-19 Kalkaska County Monthly Summary – January 2021

The purpose of this monthly summary is to provide you with more information regarding cases referred to the health department over the past month. Information is obtained through the Michigan Disease Surveillance System (MDSS). Data provided is for confirmed cases only unless otherwise noted as probable.

There was a decrease in confirmed COVID-19 cases this month.



More than half of the cases were symptomatic during their course of illness.*



Please note: Symptomatic and Asymptomatic are both contagious

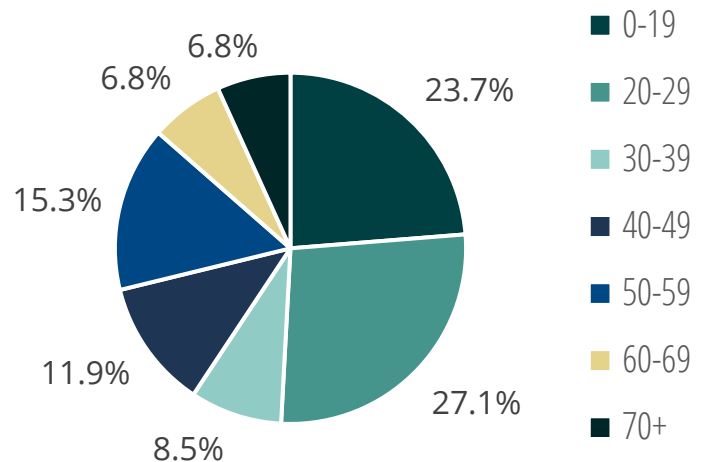
Of those with symptoms, the most common symptom was congestion.



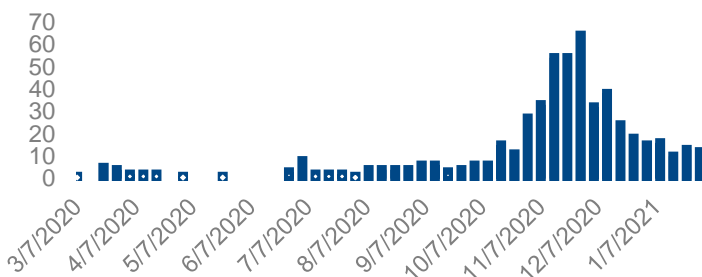
Known source of exposure has been identified for less than half of the cases.

- 5 cases are associated with named outbreaks connected to worksites and long-term care facilities.
- Of those unassociated with an outbreak, 4 cases are community contacts meaning they are connected to another positive COVID-19 case not within the same household.
- Of those unassociated with an outbreak, 7 cases are a household contact meaning they are connected to another positive COVID-19 case within the same household.
