

MICHIGAN DEPARTMENT OF HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO RE-TEST WELLS NEAR CAMP GRAYLING FOR PFAS

May 11, 2021 – The Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (MDHHS) will be re-testing residential drinking water wells near the Grayling Army Airfield, Lake Margrethe, and Maneuver and Training Equipment Site (MATES) at Range 30 for per- and polyfluoroalkyl substances (PFAS). The testing will help MDHHS determine if there are changes to levels of PFAS in residents' drinking water. There is no charge for the testing.

MDHHS or their contractor, Global Remediation Technologies, is calling well owners to schedule an appointment to collect a water sample. MDHHS will provide the test results to the well owners.
